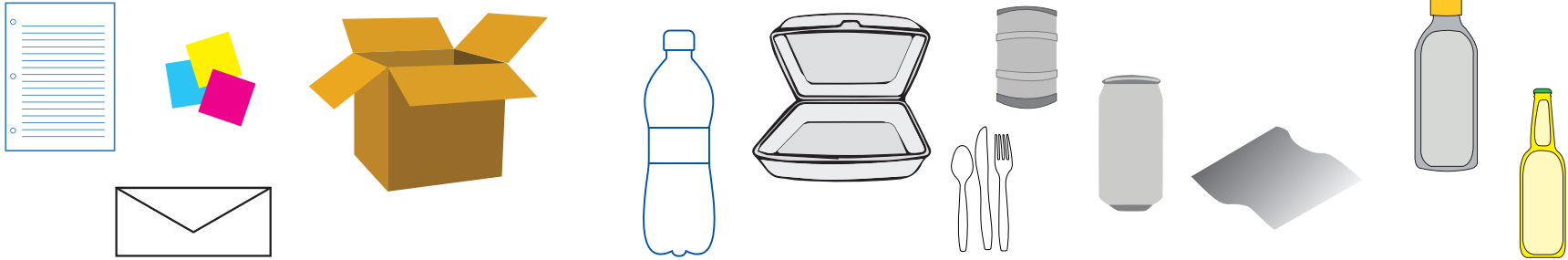


Accepted Recyclable Material at UCLA



Paper

Any color and finish

Please remove paper clips and bindings.
Staples are okay.

-
- Copy/Computer Paper
 - Cardboard
 - File Folders
 - Sticky Notes
 - Posters
 - Junk Mail
 - Envelopes (no bubble wrap)
 - Magazines
 - Brochures
 - Pizza Boxes

Unsure? Try the rip test! If it rips like paper and there are no layers of plastic or foil, you can recycle it. If not, dispose in the landfill.

NO Food Waste or Liquids.
NO Paper towels, tissues, or napkins
NO paper cups or plates

Plastic

Plastic Material #1-7, any color

Please keep lids and caps on. Please bundle plastic bags before recycling.

Empty all food and liquids into compost before recycling.

-
- Hard Plastics (yogurt cups, coffee lids, sauce cups, etc.)
 - Plastic Beverage Containers
 - To-Go Plastic Boxes (NO COMPOSTABLE PLA)
 - To-Go Plastic Lids
 - Plastic Utensils
 - Microwavable Food Trays

Unsure? Squeeze the plastic item and see if it will keep its original shape. Those that do are generally recyclable.

NO Food Waste or Liquids.

Metal

Any metal

Lids and paper clips are okay.

- Aluminum Cans
 - Aluminum Foil
 - Aluminum Trays
 - Steel Cans
 - Soup Cans
 - Tuna Cans
 - Bottle Caps

NO Food Waste or Liquids
NO Large Pieces of Scrap Metal

Glass

Any color

Please remove labels. Lids are okay.

-
- Beverage Bottles
 - Jars

NO Food Waste or Liquids
NO Lab Glass
NO Mirrors or Ceramics
NO Broken Glass
