CivicSpark is a Governor’s Initiative AmeriCorps program dedicated to **building capacity for local governments to address community resilience issues such as: climate change, water resource management, and access to opportunities.** CivicSpark is managed by the Local Government Commission in partnership with the Governor’s Office of Planning and Research.

The CivicSpark Fellowship offers a unique opportunity for recent college graduates to gain valuable experience in the sustainability field, gain professional and technical skills, and have a strong statewide network of professionals, all while having a lasting impact on local communities. Fellows implement critical projects across California on a wide range of topics, including: water resources and policy, climate adaptation and mitigation, affordable housing, and rural broadband.

The program offers three thematic tracks: Climate (50 Fellows), Water (20 Fellows), and Opportunity Access (20 Fellows). All Fellows will spend 1,700 hours over 11 months serving full time with their project partner. The regions being served by CivicSpark include: Central Coast, Greater Los Angeles, North Coast, Sacramento, San Francisco Bay Area, San Joaquin Valley, and Sierra Nevada.

Gap Assessments

Fellows interview staff and review key documents to finalize the project scope.



Volunteer Engagement

In parallel with their project, Fellows support increased volunteerism in the region.



Service Projects

Based on the Gap Assessment results, Fellows implement a specific capacity-building project.



Transitioning Expertise

Fellows provide training to staff and/or share results with key stakeholders to sustain progress.

Fellow applications for the 2018-19 service year open! Positions are filled on a rolling basis with preference given to early applicants.

June 1, 2018

Priority deadline for Fellow applications.

Mid-August, 2018

All positions are filled for the 2018-19 service year.

Early September, 2018

The service year begins with an orientation for the 2018-19 CivicSpark Fellow cohort.

Mid-September 2018

Local projects get underway!

Mid-August 2019

Projects wrap up and the 2018-19 CivicSpark cohort graduates!

Project Examples

Climate

Climate Action Plan Implementation: Implementing Climate Action Plan measures in Emeryville, Hayward, Santa Monica, Piedmont, Union City, Walnut Creek, the Sierra Nevada, Los Angeles County, Merced County, San Luis Obispo County, Santa Barbara County, and many more.

Sea Level Rise Adaptation: Supporting the research and creation of an adaptation plan for sea level rise for the City of Alameda.



Water

Disadvantaged Communities Involvement Program (DCI): Completing a strengths and needs assessment to better engage and allocate resources for overburdened communities in the Santa Ana River Watershed.

Water/Energy Nexus: Identifying and implementing water and energy saving projects in San Mateo County schools and public buildings through an auditing program.

Opportunity Access

Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities: Providing technical assistance for the Affordable Housing / Sustainable Communities (AHSC) grant program.

Benefits

- » \$16,000+ Living Allowance (before taxes) spread evenly over 11 months
- » \$5,920 Segal Education Award upon completion
- » SNAP (Food Stamps) for eligible participants
- » Forbearance on existing qualifying student loans and payment of interest accrued during service term
- » Health insurance
- » Childcare assistance for qualifying Fellows, paid to an eligible provider of your choice
- » Significant professional development training
- » Network development with regional and statewide contacts in the climate change and water management industries
- » Connection to a network of hundreds CivicSpark alum, and hundreds of thousands of AmeriCorps alums

Qualifications

AmeriCorps Requirements

- » Be a citizen, national, or lawful permanent resident alien of the United States of America
- » Ability to pass FBI, CA DOJ, out-of-state (if applicable), and NSOPR background checks prior to service

CivicSpark Requirements

- » A 4-year degree from an accredited college or university
- » Commitment to the full term of service (11 months)
- » Capability to work in a professional office setting
- » Strong communication (both verbal and written) and teamwork skills
- » Subject area coursework and/or professional experience in related field
